



Policy on Evaluating Continuing Education Activities

The American Academy of CME requires an evaluation of all activities it certifies for continuing education credit. The evaluation must, as a minimum:

- measure the effectiveness of the activity in meeting the identified educational needs of the target audience.
- assess the quality and relevance of the content to the stated objectives of the activity.
- determine the extent to which the educational objectives were met
- measure the participants' perception of enhanced professional effectiveness.
- determine if the content was appropriate and consistent in scope for the target audience
- determine if the content was fair balanced, and free of commercial bias.
- identify change in knowledge
- measure a perceived change in competence/practice
- identify barriers that may prevent change
- seek requests for future topics
- be used to plan future activities
